We deliver environmentally sustainable and culturally grounded solutions to ensure the health and wellbeing of our whanau, hapu, rangatahi, and mokopuna. Our mission focuses on reviving indigenous knowledge, reconnecting with nature, and regenerating our environment for a thriving future.

Our Mahi

We provide ecological restoration services aimed at achieving Taiao Ora while uplifting and enhancing our local ecosystems. Operating within our takiwā, we partner with you to deliver effective and efficient solutions that enhance and rejuvenate the environment.

- **1. Pest Plant and Animal Control:** We offer comprehensive solutions for ecosystem balance. They include pest plant removal and setting and maintaining traplines for pest animals.
- **2. Native Plant Sourcing and Maintenance:** Land preparation, native seed collection, eco-sourcing of plants, planting and ongoing maintenance of native flora.
- **3. Corporate Training and Cultural Responsiveness:** We offer customised packages for businesses and organisations to build cultural competency. These include Taiao-focused volunteer days and community events.
- **4. Back Office Support:** Our support system helps you develop the skills to employ staff, set up legal entities, apply for receive financial support and market your organisation. We also offer assistance with enterprise creation that helps our young people develop their business ideas.













Our Performance

Puhinui Stream Projects:

Since 2019, we have been dedicated to restoring and revitalising the Puhinui Stream and Reserve. Over an area of 22,840 sqm, we have implemented effective pest control strategies to eradicate invasive species such as gorse, privet, woolly nightshade and various invasive vines. In their place, we have planted 51,000 native plants, achieving an impressive 80% survival rate.

These efforts have significantly enhanced biodiversity, creating thriving habitats and promoting the growth of native flora and fauna. Our work has also improved water quality and flow, contributing to the ecosystem's overall health and ensuring the sustainability of this precious taonga for future generations.

This project is scheduled for completion in 2030.

Community Engagement:

We believe in the power of collective action and regularly host Giveback days to involve local communities, schools and corporate groups in environmental restoration. These events provide hands-on opportunities for participants to connect with the environment by planting native species, removing invasive plants and cleaning waterways. Our work in the Puhinui and surrounding ecosystems fosters a deeper understanding of ecological challenges and empowers individuals to become active kaitiaki (guardians) of their environment. The engagement strengthens community bonds and ensures the success of our restoration projects through collective care and stewardship.

Innovation:

As leaders in environmental restoration, we employ innovative approaches to address ecological challenges. We ensure efficient and sustainable solutions by combining traditional Māori knowledge with cutting-edge technologies, such as drones for pest monitoring and water quality assessment. Our development of Tuuhono ki Taiao, a rangatahi-led resource kete, exemplifies our commitment to fostering creativity and innovation among future generations.

Our dedication to excellence has been acknowledged through prestigious awards, including: <u>Mayoral Conservation Award (2019)</u>: Recognised for our outstanding contributions to conservation and the sustainable future of our waterways and ecosystems.

<u>Kūmara Award (2024)</u>: Honoured for our innovative methods and community-driven approach to ecological restoration, highlighting our role as a leader in environmental sustainability.
